

Discover through the lives of seven men the answer to tremendously important questions that almost everyone has, namely: What is a man? What makes a man great?


This simulcast will help answer the single question that every man asks at one time or another, whether implicitly or explicitly - How can I be great in my own life?

- Help serve and/or clean-up at funeral luncheons

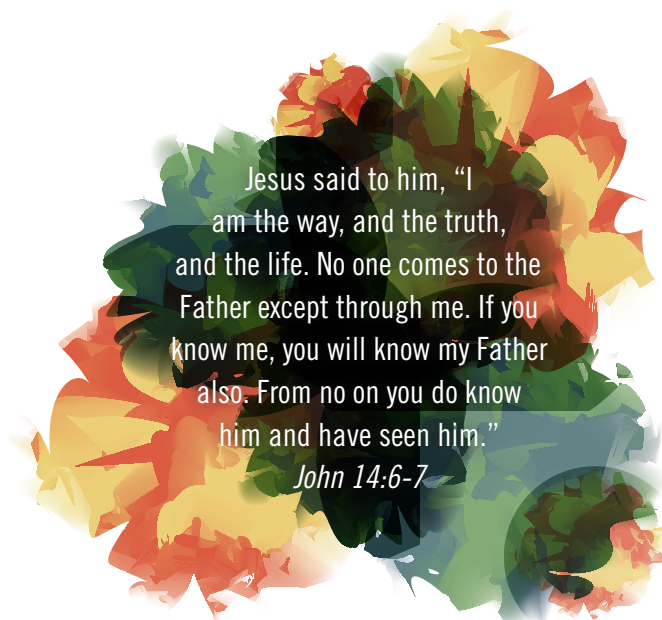

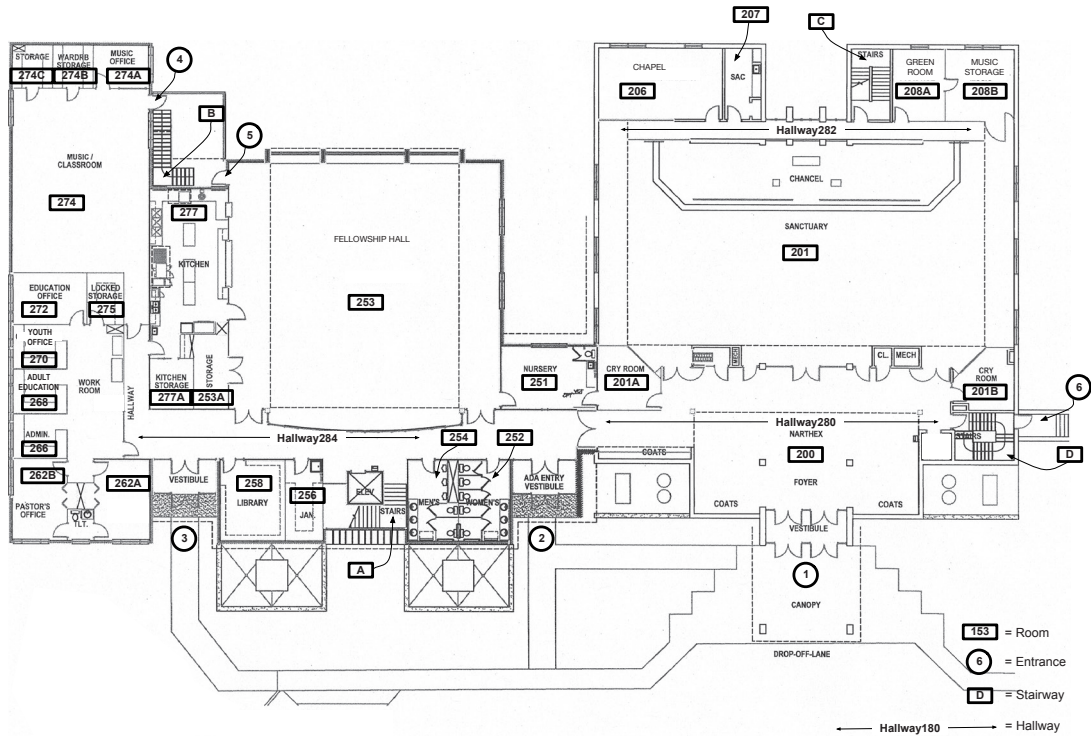
